Dr Green Memorial Shotgun Range

Range Availability

Thanks to a great recruiting effort by Mike Harper, we now are able to have RSO's to open the Dr. Green shotgun range every Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 1pm to 3 pm. We invite our members to join us and the experience of breaking some clay targets. The range is set up so that YOU the shooter can choose which targets you want to shoot. The format is a 25 shot round shooting 5 shells from 5 different shooting stations. If you need a shotgun, we have both 12and 20-gauge shotguns available for rent as well as 12 & 20 ga ammunition. The price is reasonable and breaking clays is a great way to spend a couple of hours.

If you have never tried shotgun shooting, we have an instructor available that will provide instruction. The learn to shoot includes gun, ammo, hearing and eye protection and will be available by appointment. Please contact Rick Hill @ rhill1105@aol.com to set up your appointment. Precision Rifle & Bullseye Pistol Starting Soon

Get those .22LR rifles and pistols cleaned, lubed, and ready to go! The Chapter's weekly Precision Rifle and Bullseye Pistol shooting series starts on Monday, May 1, at 6:00pm at the Rifle/Pistol range. Note the time change from last year – we're trying a later start to encourage those not available earlier to join us for some fun and informal competition! Ladies and gents, experienced and beginners, young and...young at heart! If you shoot .22LR, come out and join in the fun and camaraderie.

We shoot pistol and rifle on alternating Mondays: rifle on the first and third Mondays, and pistol on the second and fourth Mondays (we don't have the range reserved on fifth Mondays of the month, as infrequently as they occur). All range rules and procedures apply; bring your eyes and ears, cased guns only until the range is hot, and we fire at paper targets from behind the red firing line.

OTHER NEWS

Membership Cards

The following message is from your Editor, and him alone. I can get just as confused as the next guy about, well, anything. Just ask Mrs. Editor. But I am pretty clear, thanks to a lot of help, on what our membership cards are and what they are not. I'm hoping I can convey what I have learned in a winsome way.

First, your printed membership card comes from National, not your Chapter. It can take a few months to get them sorted, printed, and mailed out. And once it's in the hands of the USPS, well, you'll get them... soon. All that to say that your Membership Director doesn't control when you get your card. At all. Not even a little bit. The Director is a volunteer and is not paid enough to deal with angry members demanding to know where their cards are. So stop. Please.

Which leads me to Point 2. The only card that matters, the card that gives you access to the Chapter, is the plain proximity card you were given when you joined. You never get a new one, unless you lose yours and need a replacement. Each year, once your dues are paid, your proximity card is reactivated and your access to the Chapter





is unhindered. You will still need, of course, your range sticker to use the ranges on the property.

Finally, anyone who accesses the Chapter property and is not a current member, or has not paid his dues, is trespassing. All members must wear their member cards displayed, and present them when asked. If it is January, February, March, etc., and you still haven't received your current year printed card, that will be understood. No one will frog march you out as long as your dues are paid. Trespassers put the entire Chapter at risk should they injure themselves or anyone else. An insurance claim from a nonmember could close the Chapter for good. I'm not asking you to police the gate or grounds. If someone tries to tailgate you through the gate, do not confront them. Simply note the car make and license plate if possible and let someone on the Board, or me your Editor, know, and we'll take care of it.

In short - Membership is doing a fantastic, thankless job. They cannot and do not control when you get your printed membership card. If your dues are current, your proximity card will get you on the property.

Honeybees

The first stage of the introduction of honeybees at our chapter is complete. Volunteers on chapter workday were able to create a bee enclosure including a leveled surface, ground cover, and protective fence. Volunteers removed dead standing trees that had to the potential to impact the enclosure, cleared the overgrown access road, and bush hogged the area around the enclosure. The protected enclosure is large enough for 12 hives, though we will begin with 8 hives. The bees and hives are expected to arrive sometime in April.
