# FROM THE EDITOR



Someone maliciously damaged the metal targets at the rifle/pistol range on the last weekend in July. We don't know who, but it is clear that the damage was not accidental. Well-placed, large caliber rounds significantly damaged the angle iron support structure, the big rectangular plate was peppered with ½" diameter craters, and the 10" gong was completely shot off its hangers. While it is true that there is nothing in the range rule book about metal targets, signage at the range states that

only rimfire or pistol caliber cartridges are allowed for use on the metal targets.

One of the biggest benefits of your Chapter is unfettered access to the rifle/pistol range. As range-qualified member, you are free to shoot allowable firearms and calibers whenever you want while the range is open. If you need a refresher, refer to Page 5 of the Rifle Pistol Range Rules under the heading <a href="Firearms/Ammunition">FIREARMS/AMMUNITION</a>. There need not be an RSO present to open the range. With that freedom, like any other freedom, comes the responsibility to use common sense. Abusing this liberty may mean the necessary restriction of access to the range by requiring the presence of an RSO, at a minimum.

If you are going to shoot at the rifle/pistol range, use your common sense. Don't blast the targets and support structures because it you think it is funny or macho. Don't rapid fire your semiauto rifle because it makes you 'look cool.' It doesn't. Don't ruin it for everyone. Thank you.
