# LAKE AND CONSERVATION REPORT

#### Front Entrance Update

The chapter has been having problems at the front gate for the past several months where the gate would open at around 11:00 AM and remain locked open until about 5:00 PM. This was very problematic on sunny days and the gate error code read that the sensor was being activated so the

gate could not close. A working gate is imperative to the operations of the chapter.

We knew we had a bad sensor and assumed it was the electronic eye



that was being activated by the sunlight causing the gate to lock open. When the gate company arrived to diagnose the issue, it turned out the problem was the in- ground sensor getting triggered as the asphalt heated up.

We have marked the current sensor with white spray paint to indicate where it is in the pavement. The approach sensors will be replaced and we will spray paint them once they are installed.

#### Chapter Entrance cleanup

The facilities team has been working to clean up much of the foliage prior to the chapter entrance. The scrub trees have been cut back to make the entrance easier to find. Please also notice that the the daffodils planted at the fall chapter workday are blooming!

#### February Chapter Workday = Success

BSA Troop 2 contacted our Chapter in December looking for an outdoor service project for their scouts. We set up a chapter workday on February 25 to coordinate a combined team to remove autumn olive. With the assistance of the scouts and our volunteers, we were able to clear 3+ acres of the thickest foliage in the chapter. This area was dense with autumn olive, multiflora rose, Virginia creeper, grape vine, and poison ivy. Our combined team worked for 5 hours to completely clear it out.



The results of this workday are that, for the first time in over 20 years, one can see the top of the ridge from the road in the campground. The invasive species that took over large sections of our forest are now cut and stacked into large piles that create habitat protection for small mammals in the forest. The lake and conservation team will continue to eradicate any new growth in the cleared area.





How does one explain to the 11-15 year-old scouts who volunteered that they saved a forest with their amazing effort? They may not see it today or even next year, but they will understand the role they played in 20 years when they see a rejuvenated forest that was being completely choked out from these highly invasive species.



We cannot thank the scouts from Troop 2, their Scoutmaster Roy Walker, and his Assistant Scoutmasters enough for their assistance. We also need to thank our Chapter Volunteers that worked tirelessly on the workday including Terry Henry, Steve Nurkowski, David Campbell, Dennis Adams, Tom Sherwood, Charlie Weiss, Braydon Gilson, Dean Gilson, Eric Raybuck, Jeff McCall, and Tim Mayfield.

We will be planning another chapter workday in that late spring. This next workday will be focused on routine maintenance including painting.

#### The Bee Team

The bees are the way! The first stage of the introduction of honey bees at our chapter is complete. Volunteers on chapter workday were able to create a bee enclosure including a leveled surface, ground cover, and protective fence. Volunteers removed dead standing trees that had to

the potential to impact the enclosure, cleared the overgrown access road and bush hogged the area around the enclosure.

## **OTHER NEWS**

#### **Eagle Scout Project Completed**

lan Liang of BSA Troop 22, Stephens City, Virginia completed one of the most important safety projects ever done at the chapter. Ian redesigned and built 6 water rescue stations along Lake Neff.

We reviewed the problems with the previous water rescue rings with Ian. Those issues included rotted ropes, ropes that would dangle on the ground where they would be caught in the zero turn mower blades and real estate signs marking "No Swimming" in the summer and "Stay off the Ice" in the winter. The warning signs were getting blown over, moved for mowing, and needed to be manually changed with the seasons.

Ian designed water rescue stations with new life saving rings. He developed standardized signs marking the with stations clear instructions for swimming/stay off ice that included easy to read graphics. Ian used water rated rope that is enclosed in a throw bag. The throw bag contains the rope so it will not interfere with mowing and it also protects the rope from degraded by UV light. Ian



also created a maintenance plan for checking the different components used for water rescue with a simple checklist at each station.

Ian is the son of Paul and Cissy Liang and is a senior at Sherando High School. The chapter wishes him success in his Eagle Scout board of review and we cannot thank him enough for his innovative project that will protect all of our members and guests that use Lake Neff.

The chapter would also like to thank volunteer Eric Raybuck for his assistance as project coach and chapter representative.


#### Jake's Bait & Tackle
